Fort Bend County Community Development Department HOME American Rescue Plan (ARP)

Allocation:

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has notified Fort Bend County that it has been allocated \$3,322,057.00 in HOME-ARP Program funds.

HOME-ARP Allocation Plan:

In order to receive the HOME-ARP grant, the County is required to submit a HOME-ARP Allocation Plan to HUD for review. The HOME-ARP Allocation Plan must describe how the County intends to distribute its HOME-ARP funds, including how it will use these funds to address the needs of HOME-ARP qualifying populations.

Qualifying Populations:

HOME-ARP funds must be used to primarily benefit individuals or families from the following qualifying populations:

- Homeless, as defined in section 103(a) of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11302(a));
- At-risk of homelessness, as defined in section 401(1) of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11360(1));
- Fleeing, or attempting to flee, domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking, as defined by the Secretary;
- In other populations where providing supportive services or assistance under section 212(a) of the Act (42 U.S.C. 12742(a)) would prevent the family's homelessness or would serve those with the greatest risk of housing instability;
- Veterans and families that include a veteran family member that meet one of the preceding criteria.

Eligible Activities:

HOME-ARP funds can be used for four eligible activities:

- 1. Production or Preservation of Affordable Housing
- 2. Tenant-Based Rental Assistance (TBRA)
- 3. Supportive Services, including services defined at <u>24 CFR 578.53(e)</u>, homeless prevention services, and housing counseling.

- 4. Purchase and Development of Non-Congregate Shelter. These structures can remain in use as non-congregate shelter or can be converted to:
 - 1) emergency shelter under the Emergency Solutions Grant program;
 - 2) permanent housing under the Continuum of Care; or
 - 3) affordable housing under the HOME Program.

Administrative and Operating Funding:

HOME-ARP provides up to 15% of the allocation for administrative and planning costs. In addition, HOME-ARP can provide up to 5% of its allocation for operating costs of Community Housing Development Organizations (CHDOs), other non-profit organizations, and homeless providers. Additional HOME-ARP funding is available to these organizations for capacity building activities.
