FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – February 2019

From February 1, 2019 through February 28, 2019, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 94%. The save rate for dogs was 96% and for cats it was 89%. *

- 47 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Pilot Program for December 2019.
- The save rate does not include 6 dogs that were owner requested euthanasia for the month of February 2019.
- Three of these dogs were owner requested euthanasia for head to lab bite investigations, two dogs that were owner requested due to age (16 and 18 years old) and one dog that was owner requested euthanasia for extreme aggression to owner and family members.
- Three additional dogs were humanely euthanized at FBCAS for severe medical issues.
- Two cats were owner requested euthanasia for head to lab bite investigations.
- Five cats were severely injured on intake and were humanely euthanized as was one cat in the shelter for a severe medical issue.

Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.

Our dedicated staff would like to thank all of our adopters, rescue partners, fosters, volunteers and community members who played a part in every life saved at FBCAS this month.

*Formula used: $\text{Intake} - \text{all euthanasia outcomes} \div \text{Intake} - \text{owner requested euthanasia}$
