

HOME-American Rescue Plan (ARP) Allocation Plan
Fort Bend County
Public Meeting Notice

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has allocated \$3,322,057.00 to Fort Bend County in HOME-ARP program funds to provide housing, services, and shelter to specific qualifying populations (QPs). These four QPs are:

1. Homeless as defined in 24 CFR 91.5;
2. At risk of Homelessness as defined in 24 CFR 91.5;
3. Fleeing or Attempting to Flee Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault, Stalking, or Human Trafficking(referred herein as domestic violence/sexual assault/trafficking); and,
4. Other populations who do not qualify under any of the populations above but meet one of the following criteria:
 - A. Other Families Requiring Services or Housing Assistance to Prevent Homelessness
 - B. Those At Greatest Risk of Housing Instability

The HOME-ARP statute reflects Congress's intent that HOME-ARP activities benefit all four QPs to address housing instability and homelessness. In accordance with the HOME-ARP statute, the County must design and administer the HOME-ARP program to provide all four QPs with access to HOME-ARP projects or activities. The eligible HOME-ARP activities are:

Supportive Services
Acquisition and Development of Non-Congregate Shelters'
Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA)
Development of Affordable Rental Housing (Permanent Supportive Housing PSH)
Non-Profit Operating
Non-Profit Capacity Building
Administration and Planning

The County must indicate the amount of HOME-ARP funding that is planned for each eligible HOME-ARP activity type in the allocation plan submitted to HUD. The allocation plan must be submitted to HUD by March 31, 2023.

Public Meetings will be held on Tuesday, January 24, 2023 at 10 am and on Tuesday, January 31, 2023 at 1:30 pm at the William B. Travis Building 301 Jackson St., 6th Floor Meeting Room, Richmond, Texas to receive comments from the public regarding HOME-ARP qualifying populations and eligible activities. Comments will be incorporated into the draft HOME ARP Allocation Plan, as appropriate.
