On Monday, November 10th, Fort Bend County and the City of Stafford leaders attended the Ground Breaking Ceremony for Brand Lane, held at 4303 S. Main, Stafford, Texas (O'Reilly Auto Parts @ Brand Lane and Hwy. 90 A).

The ground breaking consisted of a short program announcing the plans for improvement of Brand Lane. "This is one of the last projects of the 2007 Fort Bend County Mobility Bond Project. We are excited to finally get this last piece of the puzzle completed. The new road will offer a much safer situation for the residents, businesses, and churches in the Brand



The East Fort Bend Human Needs Ministry (EFBHNM) Holiday Food Baskets are distributed during the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays and include everything needed to cook a traditional holiday meal. Families only need to pre-register/sign up to receive a holiday basket on a specified day and then return to pick up the food basket on a designated day prior to the holiday. Although the East Fort Bend Human Needs Ministry Thanksgiving registration has already passed, there is still time to sign-up for the Christmas Registration period!

Christmas Food Basket Program dates:

Sign-up date/time - Monday, Dec. 1st - 10 am - 1 pm

Pick-up date/time - Monday, Dec. 22nd - 10 am - 1 pm

Since its inception in 1990, East Fort Bend Humans Needs Ministry (EFBHNM) has been serving the basic human needs of families in temporary financial crisis. Services are provided primarily to residents of East Fort Bend County as well as referrals from area congregations and other social agencies.

The Brand Lane street construction will consist of 4 major improvements:

Update to a three-lane concrete section with a center left turn lane; Install sidewalks and storm sewer; Reconstruct the waterline; Adjust sanitary sewer lines.

Construction of Brand Lane will extend from Avenue E to US Hwy 90 A. The estimated completion date is early 2016 and the total project cost is approximately \$7 million, with the City of Stafford incurring almost \$2.5 million of that total. This project is a joint venture between the City of Stafford and WCID #2.

Motorist traveling down Brand Lane can expect traffic delays during the construction. Digital signs will notify motorists of upcoming changes and detour signs, traffic cones, and barrels will be utilized to control the flow of traffic. Mail service will not be disrupted for the duration of the project.

The Second Mile Mission Center is also making a big impact on Fort Bend County residents. Over 100 people visiting Second Mile Mission Center in November received hot Thanksgiving meals. The meals contained sides such as rolls, mashed potatoes, green beans, and more.

For two days in December, Second Mile's clothing room will be transform into a Christmas Toy Store, where preregistered families can purchase toys for their children at 30 to 80 percent off retail prices. 320 families have registered for this event so far. Also through Second Mile's "Gifts of Love" program, families in need will enjoy a special Christmas celebration hosted by Sugar Creek Baptist Church.

Second Mile began in 1990 when a concerned group of men and women saw the need in the community and felt compelled to respond. Then, in 2002, Second Mile became an independent 501(c)(3) nonprofit supported by grants, organizations and individuals throughout the area.
