On Thursday April 14<sup>th</sup>, Commissioner Prestage, County Officials, Water Control & Improvement District #2, City of Stafford Officials and BAPS Temple attended a Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for Brand Lane, held at the intersection of Ludwig & Brand Lane.

The ribbon cutting signified the completion of one of the last remaining projects from the 2007 Fort Bend County Mobility Bond Project. "...We are excited to finally get this last piece of the puzzle completed. The new road will offer a much safer situation for the residents, businesses, and churches in the Brand Lane area," said Commissioner Prestage.

The 1.25 mile project consisted of several improvements: an upgrade to a two-lane concrete road with a center left turn lane; Installation of sidewalks and a storm sewer; Reconstruction of the waterline and an adjustment to sanitary sewer lines. The street construction of Brand Lane, a joint venture between Fort Bend County, City of Stafford and WCID #2 cost approximately \$7 million and now extends from Avenue E to US Hwy 90A.



Saturday, April 9 at the Missouri City Community Park, Fort Bend County Precinct 2 Commissioner Grady Prestage threw out the first pitch to kick off AccessHealth's 4<sup>th</sup> Annual *Community Challenge* Tournament. The event raised over \$25,000 to provide health care services for the low-income and uninsured in Fort Bend County and the surrounding areas.

Fort Bend Businesses teamed up to sponsor and compete at softball, volleyball and kickball in a bracket style, fun-filled event for all ages. Attractions included food trucks, raffles, a rock climbing wall, bouncy house and other children's activities. All proceeds will help AccessHealth provide health care to families and individuals who would otherwise likely go without the medical care they need.




