Houston Symphony Rocks Dulles High!

To date more than 824 residents have applied for some kind of assistance from the Federal Emergency
Management Agency since damaging flooding moved through earlier this month in the 2016 Memorial Day Flood.
Today, FEMA will expand their capabilities at Huggins Elementary School, bringing representatives from FEMA, the Small Business
Administration, Non-profit community agencies, the State of Texas, and local specialists to help answer questions and help residents navigate the disaster assistance process.

This recovery center will serve as a central location for victims from Fort Bend County who need one-on-one help. State and federal professionals will be available to assist eligible residents get help as quickly as possible.

Visiting with a recovery specialist is not a requirement for those who want disaster assistance; however, the centers are an excellent way for people to get answers to their questions about disaster aid and help applying for it. Some of the services may include:

- Guidance regarding disaster recovery
- Clarification of any written correspondence received
- Housing Assistance and Rental Resources information
- Answers to questions, resolutions to problems and referrals to agencies that may provide further assistance
- Status of applications being processed by FEMA

The Multi-Agency Recovery Center is opened from Monday through Saturday, 7:00 A.M. - 7:00 P.M., and closed Sundays.

Individuals with damage should register for assistance online at www.DisasterAssistance.gov or by calling 800-621-3362 (FEMA) from 7 A.M. to 10 P.M. before visiting the Disaster Recovery Center, since doing so can greatly reduce the time spent in line. Multilingual operators are available.

Due to last month's county wide flooding event, Fort Bend County's Road and Bridge Department has been monitoring the mosquito population with the expectation of an increase due to standing water left over from flooded areas. Fort Bend County Officials have determined Aerial Vector Mosquito spraying to be unnecessary at this time for the control of mosquito populations within the county.

As a preventative measure, FBC Road and Bridge has been spraying within a three-mile area of the river across the county twice per week. Traps set up throughout the county have shown very low volumes of mosquitoes making the Aerial spray unnecessary at this time. The county is also using a larvicide disk thrown into standing water to exterminate larvae and control the mosquito population in areas where water removal is not possible, such as ditches and heavily wooded areas.

To help with efforts to limit the mosquito population in the county, residents are encouraged to eliminate standing water if possible, dispose of debris that may hold water, and keep yards mowed and hedges trimmed.
