On September 13th, 2016, Fort Bend County Commissioners Court was presented with the American Cancer Society's 'Workplace Health Assessment Wellness Champion Award' for providing excellent wellness opportunities for its employees.

The Workplace Health Assessment Tool is a free service through the American Cancer Society that provides companies with customized recommendations based on a 60 question survey. The survey evaluates benefit design, policy, programs, tracking and communication and is conducted by the Cancer Society staff. Companies then receive a customized, action-based report measuring their offerings against national best practices and benchmarks surrounding tobacco control, cancer screening, healthy eating, physical activity and cancer care. Companies then work with Cancer Society staff to design and implement their action plan throughout the year.

Fort Bend County received second place in the nation for providing wellness services such as nicotine cessation programs, exercise programs, wellness classes, and multiple health screenings. Also included in these benefits is an

Additionally, he holds an Associate of Arts degree in Fire Service Management and an Associate of Arts degree in Criminal Justice from the Community College of Southern Nevada (CCSN), Las Vegas.



Chief Campbell will oversee a department of 74 public safety officials and staff members, comprised of four divisions: Administration, Operations, Prevention and Training and employee health clinic providing basic medical care to all that work at the County. This was the first year for the Risk Management Department to participate in the American Cancer Society's survey and officials are pleased to be rated second only to NASA in the Greater Houston Area.

Fort Bend County Libraries Expanding Online services!



Fort Bend County Libraries announces the addition of the new *Flipster*® service and its *3M Cloud Library*! These new services will allow Fort Bend County Library patrons instant access to content from anywhere in the world!

Flipster is a next-generation magazine service that allows people to browse digital versions of the latest issues of popular magazines for adults, teens, and children, courtesy of the Library. *Flipster*magazines are full-print, full-color digital duplicates of the hardcopy print magazine!

The Libraries' collection includes 35 popular titles for adults and 14 titles for youth, including selections such as *Forbes*, *Essence*, *Car* &

Education.

"I look forward to serving the City," Chief Campbell said. "I stress collaboration in all areas, and I am determined to always listen, empower and know my staff fully understands our plan of action."

The City hired its first-ever Chief Performance Officer in Kathleen Nowell. Prior to joining the City, Kathleen was the Corporate Communications Manager for the Houston-based national retail chain Francesca's. She has a Master's degree in International Affairs and a focus on policy development and has knowledge and experience in change management, facilitation, strategic planning and workforce development.

Nowell will monitor the implementation of budget projects and coordinate with staff to ensure that projects are completed in a timely manner and in alignment with the Strategic Plan.



"As a new addition to the City, my immediate goal is to get to know our teams, our strategic partners, and to align with the vision of our leadership. The goal of the Performance Office will be to provide frameworks, resources, and inspiration so that our teams can find and implement innovative solutions to their challenges," Nowell said. *Driver*, *Highlights*, *Comics & Gaming Magazine*, and much more. An online newsstand provides a carousel of the most recent issues in various categories, and many magazines provide access to back-issues as well.

The collection can be accessed **24/7**, and there is no limit to the number of magazines that can be downloaded. There will never be overdue fines for Flipster magazines because the digital file will automatically disappear after a predetermined length of time. A magazine that is published weekly can be downloaded for 2 days, and a magazine that is published monthly can be downloaded for one week.

Similar to Flipster, the new 3M Cloud Library, is an online collection of digital ebooks and e-audiobooks that can be checked out and enjoyed from a variety of mobile devices on the go or from the comfort of home.

The 3M Cloud Library collection, is accessed through a free, easy-to-use app that can be downloaded from the Apple App or Google Play stores. The app links up with Fort Bend County Libraries patrons'



accounts so the items are checked out just like any other library book.

The set-up is simple – download the free app and log in the first time with a Fort Bend County Libraries card. Once patrons enter the library card ID (or barcode) number, they are ready to start browsing the collection's virtual shelves of fiction and nonfiction e-books and e-audiobooks anytime, anywhere.

Up to five titles can be checked out at a time, for a period of 14 days, after which

FBISD Invites Community Members to Submit Names for the District's Newest Schools and Facilities



Fort Bend ISD is seeking community suggestions for the naming of six new campuses and facilities through the use of an online form. The deadline to submit names is **Friday, September 30th, 2016**.

Those who wish to nominate a name must submit a written one or two paragraph statement (no longer than 250 words) containing biographical/historical data and reasons justifying the suggested name. Names nominated shall generally be names for persons or places. If a person, the individual should have attained prominence locally or nationally, and have made a significant contribution to society. If a place, the name should include historical relevance.



Additionally, officials advise that gathering pertinent information will help prepare your family for unpredictable emergencies.

Here are some useful tips:

- Fort Bend County is designated by the state as a pass-through county for evacuees who live along the Gulf Coast. As a municipality in the county, Missouri City would not be under a mandatory evacuation if a hurricane were to hit the region – so it is imperative that residents be prepared to shelter in place.
- Assess your risks and know your home's vulnerability to storm surge, flooding and wind.
- Understand National Weather Service forecasts, and especially the meaning of hurricane and tornado watches and warnings. *Hurricanes*: For a storm watch in this category, forecasters would report a possibility of winds of 74 mph and higher within 36 hours. For a warning, forecasters would report a possibility of winds at the same speed within 24 hours. *Tornadoes*: A watch is an alert to monitor the skies and a warning signals that a tornado has struck the ground and shelter must be sought immediately.


