Laura Richard stated, "Particularly in the wake of Harvey, when important documents were lost, this office will be more convenient to those in need of services."

All 3 Disaster Recovery Centers around the County remain openoffering in-person support to individuals and businesses under the Texas federal disaster declaration for Hurricane Harvey and the subsequent floods. These centers, located at the Fort Bend County Sienna Annex, Sienna Spring 5855 Way, City, Missouri Texas Simonton 77459, Community Church, 9703 FM 1489 (Simonton 77476 and *Katy* Rd.), Simonton TX Mills Mall, 5000 Katy Mills Cir, Katy, TX 77494 are operating at Monday -Friday, from 7am. to 7pm.

Recovery specialists from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA), the State and other agencies are on hand to support Fort Bend County residents with the flood assistance process.

As a reminder, homeowners, renters and businesses should register with FEMA before visiting a recovery center. All eligible residents can register for assistance the following ways:

Fort Bend ISD graduates exhibit grit and determination in all aspects of life; respect self and others; *engage in healthy life choices;* are literate and articulate; proficient with technology; and meaningfully and practically apply Federal Emergency Management Agency, the IRS announced today that affected taxpayers in Texas will receive tax relief.



## Who's Eligible?

- Affected taxpayers who reside or have a business in the disaster area as listed in <u>Treas. Reg. § 301.7508A-1(d)(1).</u>
- Taxpayers not in the covered disaster area, but whose records necessary to meet a deadline listed in <u>Treas. Reg. § 301.7508A-1(c)</u> are in the covered disaster area, are also entitled to relief.
- Relief workers affiliated with a recognized government or philanthropic organization assisting in the relief activities in the covered disaster area
- Individual(s) visiting the covered disaster area who were killed or injured because of the disaster are entitled to relief.

## How do I get Relief?

- The IRS automatically identifies taxpayers located in the covered disaster area and applies automatic filing and payment relief.
- Affected taxpayers who reside or have a business located outside the covered disaster area must call the IRS disaster hotline at 866-562-5227 to request this tax relief.

## What if I receive a penalty/fee for filing late?
