Years ago, the Historical Commission set out to gather the oral histories of key figures who've lived and worked in Fort Bend County, and have seen a significant amount of growth and development. "The real record of history is found in the lives of the ordinary people who lived it. Collecting, preserving and sharing oral histories not only transmits knowledge from one generation to the next, it enhances

our understanding of the past by illuminating personal experience." - Texas Historical Commission.

As the senior member of the Commissioner's Court, and the first African-American County Commissioner since Reconstruction, Commissioner Prestage has seen momentous change around the County.
