Annual Community Challenge!

On Saturday, April 27th, Commissioner Prestage threw out the first pitch to kick off the 7th Annual AccessHealth Community Challenge. Held at the Missouri City Community Park, AccessHealth also unveiled its new Mobile Health Clinic thanks to funding from the humanitarian aid organization Direct Relief.



AccessHealth continually seeks out additional means of bringing healthcare to those who may otherwise go without the medical attention they need. With plans for the new Mobile Clinic to provide healthcare throughout the County, AccessHealth is showing its dedication to expanding availability of medical care to ALL, particularly in times of crisis or disasters. The mobile health screening unit is equipped to provide both medical and dental services.



The *Community Challenge* proceeds support AccessHealth's mission to provide healthcare to all families and individuals, including those that are low-income, uninsured or *underinsured*. With clinics in Richmond, Stafford and Missouri City, AccessHealth provides adult and pediatric medical care, dental and behavioral health, HIV and nutrition services regardless of patients' ability to pay. Ninety percent of AccessHealth's patients are considered low-income, and 55% are uninsured.
