

ABOUT YOUR LIBRARY CARD

Requirements

- A current government-issued photo ID and proof of residence*
- Library-card applicants under age 18 must have application signed by a parent or legal guardian, who must be present and show either a current Texas driver license or proof of residence* and a photo ID

Card Cost

- · FREE to state residents
- · Out-of-state resident fee \$15
- · Replacement for lost or damaged cards \$2

Expiration Dates

Every library card has an expiration date, which is determined as follows:

- State residents 2 years from application or renewal date
- · Out-of-state residents 1 year from application or renewal date
- TexShare cardholders 1 year from application

Card renewal requirements are the same as those listed for getting a new card.

* Proof of residence may be a utility bill, auto insurance, etc., showing the applicant's name and address.

BORROWING

Library Card Guidelines


- A valid Fort Bend County Libraries card or government-issued photo ID must be presented to check out library materials.
- Library materials may be borrowed and/or returned at any Fort Bend County library.
- Most items are checked out for 3 weeks (21 days) and may be renewed for another 3 weeks if the item is not requested.
 Renewals are from date of renewal.
- Items that are renewed late or are overdue are fined at 10¢ per day per item, unless otherwise specified (Closed days and holidays are not included). Hotspots, NOOKs, and Launchpads are fined at \$5 per day.
- If fines or fees exceed \$5, additional items may not be checked out.

 Once fees are \$5 or under, borrowing privileges are restored.
- · All items checked out are the responsibility of the cardholder.
- There is a \$2 replacement fee for lost/damaged library cards.

In accordance with the Texas Open Records Act (VCTA Government Code Sec. 552.124), Fort Bend County Libraries protects the privacy of library users by prohibiting access to information about library users and their records by anyone other than the cardholder.
