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Farmers' Market Policy

Policy Title: Farmers' Markets Approvals

Overview/Purpose: To provide guidance for the identification and approval of a Farmers' Market to identify the locations where Fort Bend County Environmental Health (EH) issued Farmers' Market Vendor Permits are valid. A Farmers' Market is defined as a "designated location used for a recurring event at which a majority of the vendors are farmers or other food producers who sell food directly to consumers" in §437.020 of the Texas Health & Safety Code as amended in the 87th Texas Legislative Session effective 6/15/2021.

Policy

- 1. A Farmers' Market Vendor Permit application must be submitted, along with applicable fees.
- 2. This permit is only valid at an approved Farmers' Market.
- 3. Farmers' Markets must be certified by the Texas Department of Agriculture.
- 4. Events that do not have EH approval to operate as a Farmer's Market will be determined to be a Temporary Event and EH issued Farmers' Market Vendor Permits will not be valid for operation at any Temporary Event.
- 5. Temporary Event permits will not be issued for any vendor at an EH approved Farmers' Market.
- 6. Food prepared offsite must have manufacturers food license.
- 7. Manufacturers must provide a manufactures license upon request.
- 8. No permit is required for Cottage Food Vendors. If samples are given, the vendor must adhere to the required sanitary requirements to attend a Farmers Market, as stated in THSC 437.020(c).
