Exciting News! FBT Tickets are now Mobile

Same Tickets. Same Routes. Now Mobile.

Fort Bend County, TX, April 5, 2023 – Fort Bend Transit (FBT) is excited to announce the launch of its mobile ticketing option in collaboration with Token Transit. Mobile tickets, known as “passes”, are available through the Token Transit app, which can be downloaded today for free. FBT’s mobile passes are available for purchase beginning April 3, 2023.

Mobile passes are available in Token Transit’s digital app that can be downloaded from Apple’s App Store, Google Play, or Token Transit’s website at www.tokentransit.com. Individual passes and bulk passes, similar to physical ticket books, are offered for all current Commuter Park and Ride routes and for the Demand Response service. The cost for mobile passes remains the same as the corresponding physical ticket option. Fare information can be found on FBT’s Fares webpage at www.FBCTransit.org.

FBT takes great pride in Connecting Communities within Fort Bend County and being a smarter way to travel for the county’s citizens. The implementation of mobile ticketing is a continuation of FBT’s efforts in providing convenient, affordable, reliable and safe transportation. The Token Transit app’s high download and usage rate within the first few hours of its launch demonstrates FBT’s ability to listen to its riders while simultaneously responding effectively to their requests.

FBT offers two public transit services: Commuter Park and Ride and Demand Response. FBT’s Commuter Park and Ride service provides weekly transportation to the Texas Medical Center, Greenway Plaza, and Galleria areas of Houston with both morning and evening schedules. Current operating schedules and stop locations can be viewed on FBT’s Services webpage at www.FBCTransit.org.

There are three Commuter Park and Ride lot locations:

- Fort Bend County Fairgrounds in Rosenberg
- University of Houston – Sugar Land
- First Colony AMC Theatre

FBT’s Demand Response service is a curbside-to-curbside, shared ride service for the citizens of Fort Bend County. The scheduled ride transportation service provides trips within Fort Bend County. About Fort Bend Transit


In 2005, the Fort Bend County Commissioners Court approved the creation of the Fort Bend County Public Transportation Department (FBCPTD) to serve the general public in Fort Bend County. The purpose of FBCPTD is to provide seamless service between urban and rural communities; access rural transit funding and increase services to residents in Fort Bend County without increasing a financial burden to the taxpayers. As of June 14, 2021, FBCPTD is known as Fort Bend Transit, or FBT.

FBT's mission is to provide safe and efficient public transportation services while maintaining service quality and customer satisfaction.
